OLD TESTAMENT *Ezekiel 34:11-16*

¹¹ "For thus says the Lord GoD: Behold, I, I myself will search for my sheep and will seek them out. ¹² As a shepherd seeks out his flock when he is among his sheep that have been scattered, so will I seek out my sheep, and I will rescue them from all places where they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. ¹³ And I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land. And I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the ravines, and in all the inhabited places of the country. ¹⁴ I will feed them with good pasture, and on the mountain heights of Israel shall be their grazing land. There they shall lie down in good grazing land, and on rich pasture they shall feed on the mountains of Israel. ¹⁵ I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I myself will make them lie down, declares the Lord God. ¹⁶ I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up

the injured, and I will strengthen the weak, and the fat and the strong I will destroy. I will feed them in justice. (ESV)

EPISTLE 1 Peter 2:21-25

²¹ For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you might follow in his steps. ²² He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth. ²³ When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten, but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly. ²⁴ He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. ²⁵ For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls. (ESV)

HOLY GOSPEL John 10:11-16

¹¹ I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹² He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³ He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. ¹⁴ I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, ¹⁵ just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶ And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. (ESV)

SERMON

The readings for today remind me of a story about a pastor who did children's sermons during the divine service. It was at a country church where the children knew about livestock, so he thought he was safe when he asked them, "What does a shepherd do with his sheep?" A little boy who was excited to know the answer exclaimed, "He kills them and eats them!" That's just one more reason to *not* do children's sermons in the divine service.

According to the Old Testament reading for today, however, the little boy's answer is partly correct when the Lord says, "the fat and the strong I will destroy." But there is a long list of other things a shepherd does. He searches for and looks after the sheep. He rescues them, gathers them out of dangerous places, and brings them to good pasture. The shepherd tends and feeds the sheep; he searches for the lost and brings back the strays; he heals the injured and strengthens the weak. In other words, a shepherd goes to great lengths take care for his sheep.

This is the imagery that Jesus uses in the Gospel reading where he calls himself the "good shepherd." As the good shepherd, he personally knows his sheep and they know him in a similar way that the Father knows Christ and he knows the Father. Furthermore, as the good shepherd, Jesus loves his sheep more than himself and lays down his life for the sheep. We Christians are his sheep. Christ Jesus laid down his life for us; he died on the cross to pay for all of our sins.

Unlike the hired hand who cares nothing for the sheep and runs away when he sees the wolf coming, Christ fought the predator, Satan, and beat him in order to protect us from destruction. Christ overcame the devil by laying down his life for us in death so that by the power of his resurrection from the dead he would give us eternal life. Now, sin, death, and the devil cannot destroy us who are in Christ by faith, hope, and love.

In the Epistle reading, St. Peter further explains about the death and resurrection of Christ for our forgiveness and new life in him. He says, "you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls." This new life in Christ is one in which we are viewed as his own repentant sheep who have been brought back to Christ. And Peter refers to Jesus as the "shepherd and overseer;" or in ecclesial terms Christ is our pastor and bishop. He is not a pastor and bishop who governs us, like a civil leader or even a corporate CEO. Rather, he is our one true pastor and bishop who serves us, protects us, tends us, heals us, feeds us, and strengthens us. He does this for us by calling and ordaining under-pastors and under-bishops to preach and teach his Word to us and administer his Baptism, his Absolution, and his Body and Blood for our forgiveness, salvation, eternal life, and communion with God the Father, in Christ, by the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen!

NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate.
