OLD TESTAMENT *Isaiah 29:17-24*

¹⁷ Is it not yet a very little while until Lebanon shall be turned into a fruitful field, and the fruitful field shall be regarded as a forest? ¹⁸ In that day the deaf shall hear the words of a book, and out of their gloom and darkness the eyes of the blind shall see. ¹⁹ The meek shall obtain fresh joy in the LORD, and the poor among mankind shall exult in the Holy One of Israel. ²⁰ For the ruthless shall come to nothing and the scoffer cease, and all who watch to do evil shall be cut off, ²¹ who by a word make a man out to be an offender, and lay a snare for him who reproves in the gate, and with an empty plea turn aside him who is in the right. ²² Therefore thus says the LORD, who redeemed Abraham, concerning the house of Jacob: “Jacob shall no more be ashamed, no more shall his face grow pale. ²³ For when he sees his children, the work of my hands, in his midst, they will sanctify my name; they will sanctify the Holy One of Jacob and will stand in awe of the

God of Israel. ²⁴ And those who go astray in spirit will come to understanding, and those who murmur will accept instruction.” (ESV)

EPISTLE *Romans 10:9-17*

⁹ If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. ¹¹ For the Scripture says, “Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame.” ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. ¹³ For “everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.” ¹⁴ How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? ¹⁵ And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, “How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!” ¹⁶ But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, “Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?” ¹⁷ So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ. (ESV)

HOLY GOSPEL *Mark 7:31-37*

³¹ Then he returned from the region of Tyre and went through Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. ³² And they brought to him a man who was deaf and had a speech impediment, and they begged him to lay his hand on him. ³³ And taking him aside from the crowd privately, he put his fingers into his ears, and after spitting touched his tongue. ³⁴ And looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, “Ephphatha,” that is, “Be opened.” ³⁵ And his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. ³⁶ And Jesus charged them to tell no one. But the more he charged them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. ³⁷ And they were astonished beyond measure, saying, “He has done all things well. He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak.” (ESV)

SERMON HYMN *TLH 364 “How Sweet the Name of Jesus Sounds”*

SERMON

The theme of the readings for today is about the importance of hearing and speaking, yes, physical hearing and speaking, but more importantly Spiritual hearing and Spiritual speaking or confessing. In anticipation of the promised Messiah, the Old Testament for today mentions the deaf being able to hear “the words of the scroll,” God’s Word. Then, the Gospel reading tells of one of the fulfillments of the Old Testament prophecy when Jesus, the Messiah, healed a deaf and mute man. In the Epistle reading, St. Paul gives a wonderful exposition of the relation of hearing the Word of Christ resulting in our justification and the confession of Jesus as Lord unto salvation. There is an inseparable connection between hearing the Gospel of Christ and the faith created and sustained in us by the Holy Spirit. There is also an interconnection between speaking or confessing the Christian faith from a believing heart and our salvation. As Paul says,

“everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.” For the Scripture says, “Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame.” And the Lord “richly blesses those who call on him.”

In the Gospel reading, we see a type of the Church and Christian people working on behalf of other people. A man is in need of healing. People bring him to Jesus and beg Jesus to heal him; they call on his name and ask for his blessing. In his own time and in his own way, which is different from the way the people expected it to happen, Jesus heals the man so he can both hear and speak. Overwhelmed with gratitude and amazement, the people speak of Jesus’ help and confess, “He has done all things well. He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak.” As Christian people, we bring people in need to Jesus both physically as well as Spiritually through our prayers. We beg our Lord to help our family, our friends, our coworkers, and others, especially those who are Spiritually deaf to God’s Word and who do not confess him as their Lord. We request our Savior to bless our fellow Christians, especially the members of Risen Christ Lutheran Church, in their physical, mental, emotional, and Spiritual lives. Then seeing our Lord’s blessing in people’s lives, especially for their justification and salvation, we are overwhelmed with gratitude and amazement; and we confess the greatness of God’s love to each other in the Divine Service and to others with whom we interact.

Dear friends in Christ, you believe and are justified. You have a right relationship, a communion relationship, in which you are now one with God the Father in Christ the Son by the power of the Holy Spirit. Through the Word of Christ, the Holy Spirit has created faith in your heart to receive from the heavenly Father all that he bestows upon you through your Baptism, Absolution, and Holy Communion, namely, remission of your sins and eternal life. God has opened the ears of your heart to hear his powerful Word and to believe it; and he has opened your mouth to confess his name both to your fellow Christians and to those who do not yet know him. Jesus says, “If you confess me before men, I will confess you before my Father who is in heaven (Mt 10:32).” Are there people that you know who are in desperate need of God’s help? I’m sure there is someone. Wouldn’t it be great to see the Lord’s blessing in their lives and to be able to rejoice with them together in his presence both now in the Divine Service and hereafter for all eternity? Our Father has done everything good for us in Christ by the Holy Spirit. Let us love and serve others in a similar way to how God has loved and served us. Amen!
